





transfer learning in those meetings. And we did talk about this and how we want to push

"We have had leaders in different schools who have taught students how to lead restorative justice circles and who do an amazing job. And who can also sit in when two students have a disagreement or even a fight. And there is some mediation needed, they have been able to come help them reach an agreement and to allow for each other to be without threat or hostility.
